Course Description:

NDU International Counterterrorism Fellowship Program (ICTFP) SNSEE's International Counterterrorism Fellowship Program is the flagship educational institution of the Regional Defense Combating Terrorism Fellowship (RDCbT) program. Under the oversight of the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Global Security Affairs/Partnership Strategy the program offers counterterrorism specialists a strategic perspective on a rapidly changing world. Courses address the global threat and its various manifestations including the modes, means, roots and potential responses to transnational terrorism, as well as discuss counterterrorism proponents and state sponsors of terrorism. Fellows, through seminar participation and independent study, develop strategies for working with the United States and other members of the anti-terror coalition to deter, preclude, minimize, respond to, combat, and defeat global terrorism. The curriculum also addresses the threat posed by weapons of mass destruction in the hands of terrorists, and allows students to devise strategies to counteract this menace. The SNSEE course awards a Master of Arts in Strategic Security Studies with a concentration in counter terrorism.

Prerequisites:

Countries participating the DoD CbT Fellowship program are eligible for participation in this program at SNSEE. Combatant commands will receive allocations for slots to each class from GSA/PS. Other countries may participate at their own expense (or through alternative funding, such as IMET), with the endorsement of the Regional Command and the approval of GSA/PS. Fellows will be encouraged to continue contacts with NDU, SNSEE faculty, and other Fellows in an alumni network that will be sponsored by NDU and GSA/PS. Student Requirements: Fellows will be expected to meet stringent English language requirements. An ECL of 90 (waiverable to 85) is considered the minimum for effective participation. NDU TOEFL requirements will have to be met for students enrolled in the master's degree program. Fellows planning to enroll in the Master's degree program must provide copies of their undergraduate transcripts (in English and original language) to the IMSO upon arrival. Students are encouraged to bring their dependents. There is a robust program available for dependents. Standard IMET per diem plus rates will apply for ICT Fellowship students. All students must be thoroughly vetted for human rights per standards promulgated for DoD CbT Fellowship participation. The ICT Fellowship will pay for all costs associated with participation in the program including travel, tuition, Counterterrorism Activities and Visits program, social receptions, and per diem plus (however, viaticos will not be covered). Students not attending as part of the formal DoD CT Fellowship program will participate fully with these costs paid by their tuition. However, no distinction will be made between students of differing funding sources. All will be considered CT Fellows during the program and in alumni programs.

Course Prerequisites: Rank O-5/O-6 or civilian equivalent with ; BA/BS four year undergraduate degree; ECL 90 and current GWOT practitioner. GSA/PS funded Fellows will receive TDY rates for M&I plus cost of lodging at the lowest TDY rate for the DC area. Billeting on Fort McNair or military billets is not available. GSA/PS funded Fellows billeted on a Metro line. Fort McNair is accessible via DC area metro.
